A Harvest Festival celebration will be held for Lower School (EKG - Year 3) on the morning of Friday 14th October which will be for children only.

UHT milk in 1 kg cartons, Long life fruit juice 1 lt, Jars of cooking sauce (chilli/sweet & sour/curry), Instant mashed potato, Instant custard powder in packets, Jars of instant coffee (100 g), Skimmed milk powder, Tinned potatoes, Tinned garden peas, Tinned carrots, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned spaghetti hoops, Jars of pasta sauce, Granulated sugar 1 kg, Rice 1kg, Tinned ready mixed custard, Tinned rice pudding, Packets of sweet biscuits, Treats: i.e. boiled sweets, Penguin, Club, Crunchie, Wispa or other chocolate bars.
