Next up was another St Edmund's team. That was Duncombe's group stage finished and the ten points they had managed to gain throughout this group stage had qualified them for the semi-finals.

Rather bizarrely, they faced the St Edmund's team once again that they had just lost to minutes earlier. Pay back was in order, but despite Duncombe being the better of the two teams it finished 0-0. To penalties again, was the order given by the referee. Duncombe had lost in this competition on penalties for the previous two years; surely this was the year for Duncombe to get the luck they rightly deserved. Unfortunately luck is not always around when required and this resulted in Duncombe losing this penalty shootout.

Despite some sad faces the penalty defeat in the semi-final qualified Duncombe for the 3rd placed play-off. Through their semi-final disappointment Duncombe mustered the desire and character to win against Loyola 1-0 to finish this year's St Edmund's Prep Tournament in third place; the very least they deserved for some very good football. We thought we would start off by interviewing our very own Duncombe sports star and ex-professional footballer Danny Granville.

Name: Danny Granville

Job: Arsenal Youth Coach, Duncombe PE & Games Coach. Ex-Professional Footballer. Nationality: English.

Premier League Football Teams Played For: Chelsea, Man City & Crystal Palace.

Capped by England Under 21s.

Interesting Fact: Mr Granville was once bought for $\pounds 1.6$ million by Leeds United from Chelsea.

LG: Where did you grow up and what football team did you support?

DG: I grew up in Islington in London. The local team was Arsenal so I supported them, it is also who my dad supported. My brother supported Tottenham and we shared a room together so half the bedroom was red and white and the other half was blue and white. I also used to like Manchester United because of Bryan Robson who was the England captain at the time.

GM: Where did your enthusiasm start for football?

DG: Probably from my dad. He loved football. My brother was only two years younger than me so we were always playing football. We used to have a concrete football pitch across the road from us,

the ones with metal goals, so we would go there and play all day. Your imagination would run wild pretending you were all manner of different players.

MB: When did you start playing Football?

DG: When I was knee high. I was always kicking a football. Even inside the house, much to the annoyance of my parents! I played whenever I could.

GM: When did you start to realise you were good at football?

DG: I remember playing in football tournaments when I was young and the response I was getting from the adults made me think that perhaps I was not bad at this?

LG: Did you star at any other sports growing up at school?

DG: I tried different sports and I think it is really important to try lots of different sports when you are young. At primary school it was always football for me. I tried rugby in secondary school and I liked athletics a lot. I used to really enjoy Sports Day, I did not always win but that did not matter.

GM: What football clubs did you play for?

DG: Cambridge United which was difficult because I had to move away from home at a young age. I signed a professional contract there. Then I moved on to Chelsea, then to Leeds United, then to Manchester City. I had a spell at Norwich and then I moved on to Crystal Palace.

GM: Which was your favourite club?

DG: There were ups and downs with all of them. But I had great times at all of the clubs I played for. Some great atmospheres like when I use to play at home for Manchester City.

LG: When did you sign your first professional contract?

DG: I signed my first professional contract at 18 for Cambridge. I was on a youth scheme before that but luckily they signed me.

GM: What was your backup plan if you could not make it as a footballer?

DG: My dad worked in tele-communications. I think if football had not worked out then probably something in that area.

LG: Did you have to give anything up in order to become a professional footballer?

DG: Yes, there are a lot of sacrifices that you have to make. Like I said, I had to move away from home at a young age so you have to sacrifice time with your family and your friends.

GM: What position did you use to play in and what did you think that you use to bring to the team?

DG: I think I was able to play in different positions which was good, I was versatile. I played predominately at left back but had the ability to play in other positions. I was an honest player and I would like to think that I always gave everything I had for my team.

LG: What was your worst injury playing football?

DG: I was out for about a year actually when I was 30. I ended up with some very bad bone bruising through wear and tear. I only managed to make one appearance that year but I did score!

LG: Who is the best player you ever played with or against?

DG: Yes it has got to be Gianfranco Zola. But I was also fortunate to play in the England Under 21s so I was fortunate enough to play with the likes of Michael Owen, Frank Lampard, Rio Ferdinand. But overall it has to be Zola. I played against Joe Cole for Crystal Palace against Chelsea and he was a very tough opponent.

GM: As you said, you were capped by England Under 21s. Were you ever close to playing for England's senior team?

DG: Yes, there was talk at times in the media, because I was a young English player coming through. Unfortunately I was not quite able to get that next step up.

LG: What is the best goal you ever scored?

DG: Best goal... There was one I scored for Chelsea in Europe (in the old Europa league). I was not that great with my right foot but there was also one I scored for Crystal Palace with my right foot.

GM: What was your most memorable moment in football?

DG: Hmmm, three come to mind. A cup final (old Europa League) when we beat German side Stuttgart in Europe. It was 0-0 and then Zola came on towards the end of the game and he scored the winner. Another was when we got promoted with Crystal Palace at the Millennium Stadium into the Premier League. The last is representing my country and playing for the England Under 21s.

LG: Now you coach at Duncombe every week. Why do you like coaching?

DG: It is what I know. I have been in football for most of my life. But I enjoy what it brings. It brings discipline, teamwork and individual brilliance.

GM: And you also coach at Arsenal? What is that like and is it hard?

DG: It is different! It is very professional as you might imagine. It is absolutely amazing to see the talent. When you first go in and you see this passing and moving that is so quick you just think to yourself, "Wow! How are these young kids doing this at their age." It is great to see the kids develop though and it is fantastic to think some of these kids are going to play for Arsenal's first team one day.


