This started at the Houses of Parliament; we were shown around by very knowledgeable guides who pointed out the dents to the wood made by Winston Churchill's signet ring during heated debates, the statues and paintings of an array of monarchs and MPs and even the stairs which Queen Elizabeth II ascends each year before opening Parliament. We were told that this year was the first year she has taken the lift, but for a lady of her age, we quite understood! Before departing, our local MP Mark Prisk graciously met with us and explained his day to day working life. He answered questions on Brexit, the Bengeo Quarry and whether we should allow President Trump to visit!

Afterwards, we carried on to the Imperial War Museum where we were able to see some of the vehicles, planes, clothing and other memorabilia from WWII which is our History focus this term.
