### Year 4 Visit The Natural History Museum

On Wednesday Year 4 visited the Natural History Museum in London for a science trip. They were all extremely excited (and so was I!) and couldn't wait to get there to start exploring. They visited the fossils and had a fascinating talk with one of the scientists about a turtle shell. They were spellbound as he talked. The children were delighted to see Mary Anning's Icthyosaur and were completely silenced when they saw the size of the Giant Sloth!

All the children were very anxious to see the dinosaurs and loved the T.Rex. They were intent on reading all the facts for each and every dinosaur and exhibit on display. We took the escalator through the centre of the earth and walked through the earthquake and volcano zone. The children sat and watched a film about plate tectonics before we moved on to the moving earthquake room which gave them some idea of the phases of an earthquake. Our final trip was to see the Blue Whale which brought gasps of wonder and amused other visitors to the museum with the children's reactions.

## **February Half Term Works**

We had a very busy programme of works for the February half term holiday and continue to invest in improvements to the school. Some works are more obvious than other so a list of the works undertaken is shown below:

- Installation of Air Conditioning in 6LT & 6S.
- Refurbishment of Corridors from Old Hall to New Hall including new suspended ceiling, LED lighting, new flooring, 4 new doors, cladding to cleaning cupboard, new dado rail, 4 new noticeboards and full redecoration.
- Refurbishment of ground floor Music Practice Room.
- Domestic style kitchen installed to Treetops ground floor room for use by Breakfast & After School Club and for curriculum based activities. Includes new units, sink, fan oven, induction hob, fridge and freezer.
- Glass display shelves added to alcove in entrance foyer.
- Additional noticeboard in Old Hall.
- Replacement noticeboard in Foyer.
- New flooring to corridor at rear of Headmaster's Office.
- LED lighting in corridor at rear of Headmaster's Office
- Refurbishment of Gas Cabinet at the back of the Kitchen.
- Upgrade to Internal Side of Dry Store Door.
- Extension of Existing Metal Fence by Pedestrian Path.
- Completion of works to create Business Manager's office to the first floor.
- Completion of New Medical Rest Room.
- Servicing of Fire Alarm System.
- Installation of lighting to first floor switch/server room.
- Enhancement of WiFi provision across the site to eliminate black spots.
- Repairs to Roof Above Staff Work Room including removal of tree from Chimney.
- Acid clean of brickwork to Treetops first floor facade.
- Removal of Redundant and Obsolete Furniture and Equipment.
- Removal of outdated wall murals in Treetops.
- 2 new teacher desks for 2LA.
- New storage unit for 3F.
- 20 high quality folding music stands and storage trolley.
- New storage racking in machinery shed.
