Science News:

This week, as part of their study of food groups and health, Year 6 have been using a blue substance called dichlorophenolindophenol (DCPIP for short) which acts as an indicator. It changes from blue to red with acids but loses its colour in the presence of certain chemicals, one of which is Vitamin C. They have been investigating different fruit juices to determine the presence of Vitamin C. They all worked really well in their groups and produced a written investigation from method to conclusion. I was very impressed with how they all worked together and discussed their results.

February Half Term Works

February half term gave us another brief opportunity to continue our development and improvement of the site.

Although we only had just over a week, thanks to the hard work of our contractors and with the support of Mr Bedingfield and Mr Beeson, we have been able to achieve the following works:

- Installation of New Access Controls to Exterior Doors at the bottom of New Wing Staircase and by 5S classroom (to be activated)
- Installation of New Dado Rail in corridor between Science Room and 3FH
- Redecoration of corridor between Science Room and 3FH
- Redecoration of Staircase and Landing to SEN Rooms
- Part redecoration of New Wing Corridor
- Part redecoration of stairwell to Site Manager's Office
- Redecoration of doors in Headmaster's Office
- Wallpaper added to the 2 walls on the Treetops staircase to match existing feature wall
- Safety check of lightning conductors on Main Building and Music Studio
- Full commercial deep clean of main kitchen
- Installation of telephone in ground floor Music Practice Room
- Upgrade to exit buttons on access controls at top of New Wing staircase and main staircase
- Complete refurbishment of the Duncombe garden including the installation of 7 raised beds generously funded by Duncombe School Parents' Association
