6LT and 6S trip to Princess Helena College's Eureka workshop

On Wednesday, 28th of February, 6S and 6LT travelled to Princess Helena College for the Eureka workshop. The journey took about 1 hour as it was snowing heavily and there were strong gusts of wind.

But when we got there we were ready to get going.

First we put on our white lab coats and made our way to another one of the school's science rooms. We looked closely at electricity. Then they tested us on the circuit symbols, since we revisited them the day before we were on top of our game. Then we did an experiment using a plasma ball and fluorescent light. Jake McPherson was asked to put his finger on the plasma ball, when he did so a blue line connected to his finger. The blue line was actually electrons. Then Jake held the fluorescent light close to the plasma ball. Because the electrons form a field of electricity around the ball the fluorescent light lit up. The experiment was very cool. Later we made our own circuits in pairs or threes, that was also very fun. Another experiment that we did was about static electricity. First, you spin the wheel on the Van de Graff generator, when you do that fast enough you see a spark of electrons and you hear a crack. It's a bit like thunder and lightning.

A few minutes after, we talked about sources of renewable energy, because coal is running out and it's affecting the air. Some of the sources we talked about were solar, wind and water power. Then some examples of these were shown. Solar-powered crickets, plane and boat.

After that we left because it started to snow quite heavily again, and Princess Helena College gave us chocolate chip cookies, courtesy of their chef. We all had a wonderful time there recapping about electricity and renewable sources of energy. By our roving reporter Annabel Ovonlen.
