Mr Thomas has detailed the excellent programme of works carried out over the summer in this newsletter, amongst which is the very exciting ICT investment of £250,000. Visibly this can be seen in the new flat screen SMART boards across the entire site, HP pupil laptops, replacement PCs and teacher tablets that have the capacity to interact with the new screens. In addition, the Wi-Fi has undergone a further upgrade and existing iPads and laptops have received software updates. Allied to all this is an excellent training programme for class practitioners directly linked to HP Head Office. This is a most exciting development for pupils and staff and puts us right at the forefront of integrated digital learning in our sector. I look forward to sharing this aspect of our whole school development across this academic year.

I was delighted to see the LAMDA results this summer with the continuance of our 100% pass rate. This year saw 73 merits and 20 distinctions. I'm sure you will agree that the pupils and Mrs Coley all deserve a very significant well done! In addition our pupils had excellent outcomes with the summer music examinations resulting in 1 pass, 7 merits and 1 distinction ranging from Grade 1-5 across voice, piano, violin, clarinet and viola. 
The Autumn Term pocket calendar will be sent home in book bags today. We have allocated one per family but do ask at the School Office if you need another one.

Summer Holiday Works

The seven weeks of the summer holiday has allowed us time to carry out a significant number of improvement works across the site which I would like to share with you.

Improvement and Remedial Works

- Removal of front screen to Astro Court in line with Planning Approval
- Full refurbishment of female staff toilet in Main School
- Replacement of stair carpet in Treetops with vinyl safety flooring
- Installation of LED lighting into Ground Floor Treetops classrooms
- Installation of 5 fly screens in Treetops Breakfast Club/ASC Room
- Installation of 16 door blinds
- Replacement of glazing panel in 4C
- Removal of curtains and poles in the Library
- Cutting back of foliage across the front of school and along Port Hill
- Installation of water supply to The Dell
- Installation of storage cupboards in Main School ASC Room
- Full redecoration of two Main School classrooms (5T & 4V)
- Part redecoration in Staff Work Room
- Clearance of redundant and obsolete equipment from across the site
- New classroom chairs in 3K
- Replacement teacher desks in 4 classrooms
- Replacement of 2 CCTV cameras
- Replacement of fire alarm control panel in Main School
- Tuning of grand piano in Old Hall and upright piano in Music studio
- Windows cleaned inside and out across the site
- Removal of outdoor play equipment in fenced adventure playground area ahead of the installation of new equipment during the coming months.
- New pipework to the front of school from Staff Room boiler.
- Remediation of IT network issues following external IT audit
- Installation of 17 smart 2075 screens in Main School
- Installation of 6 smart 6265 boards in Treetops

Statutory Checks

- Portable appliance testing
- Gas boiler servicing
- 5 year fixed wire testing
- Gas safety check on kitchen equipment
- CCTV & access control annual check

We are currently finalising our Capital Expenditure plan for the coming year and I shall share some of these highlights in the coming months.

IT Investment

Those of you that have been into school this week may have seen the fantastic new smart screens that have been installed across the site.

These screens are part of a £250k investment from Cognita in IT at Duncombe for this new academic year.

The investment includes 17 x 75" 2075 Smart Screens, 6 x 6265" Smart Boards, 40 x HP Probook 450 pupil laptops and 35 x HP Pro X2 612 2 in 1 teacher tablets.

In addition a number of desktop PC are being replaced together with the existing photocopiers and printers across the site. The investment is backed up with a strong training programme for staff so that the new technology becomes embedded within the curriculum and supports our already significant learning outcomes for pupils.

We will have an IT team on site next week to undertake the roll out of the new equipment.

We are delighted to have been chosen as one of Cognita's first schools in the UK to receive this technology investment. This, in conjunction with Señor Torres appointment as Head of ICT is an exciting new chapter in educational excellence at Duncombe.
