By asking questions about what might happen next at various points in their Oxford Reading tree texts, our Reading Experts actively encouraged Reception pupils to read for meaning.

Their Reception reading buddies hugely enjoyed the experience, as did Year 4, who loved the nostalgic trip down memory lane, reliving all of Biff, Chip and Kipper's adventures! What a wonderful way for Year 4 to put their reading skills to good use and for Reception to see where their reading will take them in years to come.
