Vocabulary Initiative

This week marks the beginning of an exciting school-wide vocabulary initiative. Our aim is to further equip all pupils from Early Kindergarten to Year 6 with age-appropriate, yet ambitious, vocabulary to engender a love of learning new vocabulary, promote reading comprehension, improve writing skills as well as encourage greater articulateness.

Pupils in Treetops will participate in learning new words via the award-winning 'Mrs Wordsmith' programme. Each week, every class will be exposed to challenging vocabulary based on a common theme. A 'Mrs Wordsmith' owl toy and certificate will be awarded each week to a pupil who uses the new word brilliantly.

Years 1 to 4 will be given the opportunity to learn ambitious language through participation in the 'Vocabulary Ninja' scheme. Pupils will have the opportunity to complete a 'vocabulary laboratory' sheet to write a definition to new, adventurous words and carry out some synonym and antonym investigations. 'Vocabulary Ninja' is also available as a free app for those children who would like to be exposed to even more vocabulary at home.

Children in Year 5 and 6 will participate in the 'Verbivore' programme (a verbivore means someone who has an enjoyment of words and wordplay) and each week will be introduced to five inspiring words linked to a theme through a variety of interactive activities. These words will be sent home as 'Fridge Words' – words to be put up on a fridge or noticeboard board at home for pupils to familiarise themselves with. Their teachers will be looking out for children who use them in speaking and writing activities!

To launch our initiative, pupils in Years 1 to 6 have been given the opportunity to participate in our 'Rocket Your Vocabulary' competition to find definitions for Duncombe teachers' favourite words. They will additionally have the opportunity to share their own favourite word. The deadline for competition entries, which should be handed to your child's class teacher, is Friday 30th November. Entry forms have gone home today. The prize-giving for entry winners will take place in a forthcoming assembly. *Miss Cartwright*

Introducing Mrs Wordsmith

Mrs Wordsmith provides a weekly challenge to all the children by listening to fun stories and activities to enhance learning and provide opportunities to increase their descriptive word vocabulary. All classes in treetops
