Firstly, may I wish you all a very warm welcome back to school.

The week started with an assembly about New Year's Resolutions, which reflected our Dreams and Goals topic being followed for PSHE. The children have been talking about what they hope for and how they are going to achieve these aspirations. I am still giving interview practice to those of our Year 6 pupils who have imminent entrance examinations and it is inspiring to hear from them of where they hope to be when they are older; architect, furniture designer, You-Tuber, vet, mid-wife, scientist and banker are all in the mix with the obligatory smattering of footballers thrown in for good measure! It would be so interesting to see whether these dreams come true, and if, in fact these jobs are still around when our children venture out into the workplace. I wanted to 'stamp' things, so banks, post-offices or libraries were all on my hit list – I don't think any of these still use actual stamps but I feel lucky to have found my dream job in teaching.

The children have all settled in really well and there is the usual buzz around the school as they discuss what they are doing in lessons. It is lovely to see friendships resuming in the playground and the mild weather has meant we have not had any rain days yet. Year 6 have continued to remain focused as they approach the remaining entrance exams and we wish them all the best of luck.

It was interesting to see that in KG, when I visited with a tour this morning, that the children had been exploring fairy tales and in particular looking this week at 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. The children were making their own porridge in the messy trays and then deciding upon which toppings would best accompany their food. This leads me in to announce that we are launching the next **Duncombe Bake Off**, details of which can be found within this newsletter. It was fantastic to see so much enthusiasm when I mentioned it in assembly this morning.

Yesterday, we had a very successful fire drill with all the children outside and accounted for in 2 minutes and 3 seconds. I also talked this morning about our Lockdown drill, so ask your children to tell you what this involves as we will be having a drill for that too during this term. This goes along -side the mandatory Safeguarding refresher training which all staff participated in on our recent INSET day and supports the belief that we are keeping your children safe at all times. We shall be speaking about Internet safety at our Parent Information Evening - Enriching Learning with Digital Technology - being held on Thursday 24th January, so I hope to see as many of you there as possible.

Today we launched our 'Reward and Relaxation' initiative in Upper School. This rewards the children for their effort and

behaviour each week, culminating in a session on Friday afternoon when they can relax and play with friends in the year group. It has been in the pipe-lines for a little while now and we are trialling to tweak as necessary. All children start off the week with the full 25 minutes (not lesson time) and if there is reason to deduct a minute for not following the Golden Rules, then those children spend the time with Mrs Micele-Jones or me before re-joining their peers. We are not using ipads as a reward, so it will be interesting to see what the children come up with — today there was lots of interaction with glove puppets!
