Across the whole school, we have been using our Green Screens and this was a particular hit with parents last night as they were transformed to weather readers or re-created being chased by sharks in the ocean! Thank you to all those parents who were able to attend. We shall be following up our E-Safety learning on 5<sup>th</sup> February and sharing with all parents the booklets that support what we cover in school.

Our week ended with a sombre but interesting assembly from 6M who were looking at World War II. Despite this being such a busy time for some of our Year 6 pupils, the children had all learnt their lines perfectly and gave rousing renditions of 'It's a Long Way to Tipperary' and 'We'll Meet Again'. Our thanks to the children and to Miss Morley for putting together this performance.

Next week, we shall be hosting our 'Future Schools Evening'; an opportunity for our Year 4 and 5 parents to find out more about our preparation for senior schools and I look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible.
