During our Inset the staff here at Duncombe, or Team Duncombe as I often use in internal emails, focused on pupil progress meetings along with safeguarding and professional development reviews. The energy and commitment displayed will come as no surprise to you at all, but I do want to commend them for the excellent start to term with the vigour, passion and professionalism that they all show. Duncombe is a very special place and it really is a privilege to lead such a dedicated and talented group of people.

The talent of our pupils continues to develop and I am delighted to share with you that two Year 6 pupils have been offered places to join two extremely prestigious orchestras recently. Alex M-L was successful in his audition held in Leeds earlier in the year and has a place as a clarinettist (one of only three) in the U11 National Children's Orchestra of Great Britain. The NCO auditions over a thousand 7-14 year olds and identifies 600 young musicians to form 11 orchestras: five age -banded national symphony orchestras and six symphonic mixed-age regional orchestras. A place in NCO gives children access to inspirational residential music courses and monthly regional orchestra rehearsals.

In addition, Thomas H was successful in his audition for the London Junior Guildhall School of Music as a saxophonist. The Junior Guildhall's Music Course offers advanced training for young people between the ages of 8 to 18. Entry to the Music Course is by audition where they look for musical potential and commitment. Masterclasses and workshops are given by distinguished visiting artists: flautist James Galway, conductor Mark Wigglesworth and pianist lain Burnside are among recent guest speakers.

I'm sure you will join me in congratulating both Alex and Thomas for such phenomenal achievements of which we all here at Duncombe are exceptionally proud. So if you would like to hear the boys and indeed many other of our talented pupils, along with a look at music and the arts here at Duncombe, do book a place at our Music at the Heart of Duncombe Event on Wednesday 8th May.

And it doesn't stop there! Lucas C of Year 4 represented

Duncombe at the National IAPS Chess championships recently. This involved a two day tournament hosted in London against competitors from across the UK. He played 9 matches in total, each of an hour in length and came out with 2nd place in the U9 section. This is a tremendous outcome and one which he can be rightly proud of. Our membership of IAPS sees us with a number of national and regional



finalists over the past two years and Lucas has carried that mantel on for us again here. Well done!
