Mr Thomas has written covering the extensive programme of works carried out over the summer. I'm delighted the ICT investment that occurred last year has been further developed with 6 more interactive Smart Screens installed across the school site. In addition, the Treetops Exploration Hub is ready for its grand opening soon and our new Reading Café in Treetops will act as a Literacy Hub to tie in with our exciting Patron of Reading work with children's author Alice Hemming. You will have also noticed the front of the school parking area has been widened completing the earlier work of the gated pedestrian area. I now need **all pupils, parents and staff to use the pedestrian entrance** when walking into school and not to walk via the car access gates please. Thank you to Mr Thomas, Mr Bedingfield and Mr Beeson for their fine work over the holidays to ensure the school continues to look great and develop in its delivery for our children.

Our assembly focus is on being safe and looking after ourselves. As we build towards the Global Be Well Day on 27th September we shall be looking at staying safe when out and about and online. I was delighted with the LAMDA results this summer with the continuance of our 100% pass rate. This year saw all outcomes at Merit or Distinction with 70% at Distinction. Five pupils gained scores of 99/100 and Reece Hurley gained 100/100. I'm sure you will agree that the pupils and Mrs Coley all deserve a very significant well done! In addition our pupils had excellent outcomes with the summer Music Examinations resulting in 5 Passes, 4 Merits and 3 Distinctions ranging from Grade 1-6 across voice, piano, violin, clarinet and alto saxophone. Thomas Hipkin gained a Distinction for Grade 6 saxophone whilst Ines Bueno and Hexia Yao achieved Distinction for Grade 1 piano. Congratulations to all our pupils and music staff.

On Tuesday this week all teaching staff attended the first annual Cognita teaching conference in London with over 1000 teachers from the 40 UK schools. The event was exceptionally positive, and I was delighted that Duncombe featured as celebratory examples on a number of occasions. I was extremely proud of Señor Torres who formed part of a panel presentation focusing on Global Citizenship and Digital learning. He was passionate, funny and thought provoking getting a fine cheer from the assembled throng and of course #TeamDuncombe!

We shall be hosting our bi-annual Senior Schools Fair on **Wednesday 2nd October from 6.30pm**. With 15 of the leading Independent 11+ schools in attendance do please make a note in your diary to attend. This is for all parents and is an excellent opportunity for families to meet with admissions teams, Headteachers and Heads of Year 7 to find out in a relaxed and informal environment about the options that lay beyond Year 6.

I'm delighted that Mr Sims has settled straight into our Games Team working very effectively with the children and staff. We also welcome Mrs Grinyer who starts on Monday as our new Assistant Bursar. You may have noticed Mr Price has been working with us this week. He will be with us until the 20th September when he then heads off to Leeds to begin his new job in surveying, for which we wish him very success.

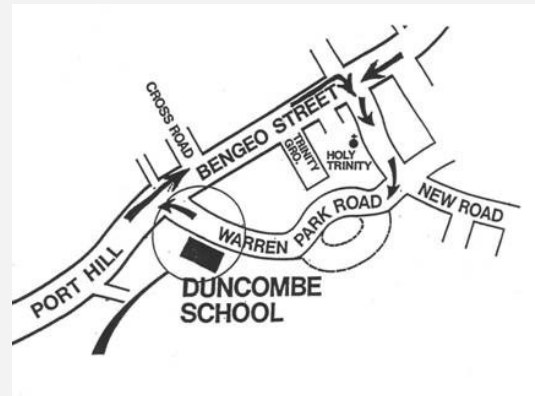

Summer Holiday Works

Over the Summer holidays, we have continued to invest in the facilities and fabric of the school and I am pleased to detail some of the main works that have taken place:

Statutory Checks

- Portable appliance testing of 1473 electrical items
- Annual service & inspection of air conditioning units
- Annual service & inspection of boilers
- Annual gas safety check of kitchen appliances

General Improvements & Upgrade Works

- Landscaping works at the front of school to create additional visitor parking
- Extension to fence by Music Studio to prevent vehicles going across the path
- Replacement of manhole cover outside Treetops
- Replacement of manhole cover in parent car park
- Removal of wooden climbing frame in Treetops garden and installation of play boat
- Installation of furniture for Treetops Exploration Hub
- Installation of new outdoor storage shed by New Hall to house disposables such as paper towels and toilet rolls from the cellar
- Installation of 6 new touch screen interactive Smartboards in - Early Kindergarten, Nursery, Treetops Exploration Hub, 5J, 6T and SEN classroom
- Redeployment of 3 75" Smart Screens in Old Hall, Staff Work Room & Headmaster's Office
- Redeployment of TV Screen from Old Hall to the foyer to display photographs and marketing materials
