Eco Team Project

In Monday's assembly, Catherine Firth from Paradise Wildlife Park came to talk to main school about endangered animals. Following on from this, Duncombe is taking part in the HEART project which is run by Paradise Wildlife Park. HEART stands for (Helping Endangered Animals by Recycling Trash) and each school that takes part is given an endangered animal. Duncombe has been given the gibbon.
